Our volunteers sample from 6 to 8 locations on the Willett and Little Falls Branches in the Little Falls watershed on Wednesday mornings. The samples are sent to the Anacostia Riverkeeper lab for analysis. Data is received on Thursday afternoons. The results are posted on the LFWA website, on community list servs and on bulletin boards near the creeks.

## Responsibilities:

- Organizing the volunteers (we have 12, maybe 18 max)
  - sending out reminder notes
  - coordinating their schedules
  - finding subs or standing in for them as needed
  - provide training as needed
- Processing the data and posting results on the web site (need to at least know excel, knowledge of Squarespace would be a bonus)
- Creating posters for community bulletin boards
- Posting results on community list servs, LFWA Facebook page, TheSwimGuide.org
- Driving samples to pick-up point or organizing volunteers to do this.
- working with lab to make sure data is correct
- inventorying supplies and making sure volunteers have the necessary equipment

- Interest in environmental issues, working on an environmental or biology degree
- Familiarity with sampling and data collection
- Available to be onsite on Wednesdays when sampling is done
