The Environmental Justice Journalism Initiative (EJJI) is seeking a dedicated and passionate Environmental Justice Journalism Instructor to lead a grant-funded project from September 2024 through June 2025. This part-time position involves teaching a class of students at the Lakeland STEAM Center how to create compelling environmental justice stories. The instructor will guide students through the entire storytelling process, from conceptualization to presentation.

Key Responsibilities:

- **Storytelling Workshops:** Conduct workshops where students will choose an environmental justice story based on provided data, assign roles, arrange and conduct interviews, and produce a rough cut of the story.
- **Editing and Completion:** Supervise the editing process to ensure the final story is polished and complete.
- **Presentation and Marketing:** Assist in presenting the completed story to the community and/or marketing it to a broader audience.
- **Evaluation:** Play a crucial role in evaluating the project's impact and success.

Qualifications:

- Experience in journalism; students with relevant experience are encouraged to apply.
- Experience in education, training, or mentoring, particularly in media literacy and journalism.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills to effectively lead and engage with students.
- Understanding of environmental justice issues, particularly in Baltimore City. Knowledge of air and water quality issues is a plus.
- Proficiency with the tools necessary for creating and editing journalistic content.
